KEY

Key to room numbers

Each of the University's rooms has an individual letter code and number. Each building has a two-to four-letter abbreviation (and occasionally also numbers). Lecture theatres are indicated by 'LT' after the building code. Typically, the first digit of the number tells you what floor level the room is on.

Some examples: KKLT301 is a lecture theatre on the third floor of the Kirk building; MY501 is a room on the fifth floor of the Murphy building.
