He drew attention to the significant attributes and impact Cath has brought to Council, particularly her leadership as Chair of the Te Aka Matua Committee. On behalf of Council, he sincerely thanked Cath for her efforts and time.

- that the appointment of Mr David Smol by the Minister to a four-year term commencing 18 June was acknowledged. David was the inaugural Chief Executive of MBIE, and he is already associated with Te Herenga Waka as Chair of Wellington UniVentures.

- that contestable funding for science, along with other factors, will make it challenging for the University to match its outstanding 2023 result in securing external research funding.
- that the University has a number of initiatives underway to secure new funding through Wellington UniVentures, international contracts and by aligning our research with Government priorities.
- 6 that a showcase of Te Herenga Waka research is planned for later this year.
- that Council members acknowledged the work of the University's researchers, in an increasingly challenging and uncertain environment and asked that Professor Hyland report back regularly.

SPEAKER: PROFESSOR BRYONY JAMES, PROVOST WOMEN IN LEADERSHIP

Received:

an oral report from Professor Bryony James, Provost on Women in Leadership.

- that Whaipua, a new Women in Leadership programme, was detailed by Professor James.
- that the programme starts in July and runs for 12 months. It is expected to have 10 professional staff and 10 academic staff taking part. It involves one-on-one mentoring, peer mentoring and a series of workshops. For the first year, the programme sponsors are the seven women (out of a total of nine) on the Senior Leadership Team, Te Hiwa.
- that there is clear demand from women in mid-tier management roles and it will be beneficial to them and to the University, generating an active network of senior supportive women.
