

## Finding your own unadvertised internship or work experience

## USE A DIRECT OR NETWORKED APPROACH TO FIND AN INTERNSHIP

- Think about your degree, interests, and what experience you want to develop.
- Brainstorm or mind map what connections you have could you intern at a place you are already connected with?
- Use LinkedIn for inspiration and connection.
- Network with people and conduct information interviews to find out more about their work. If appropriate ask about future work possibilities like internships.

## OTHER GREAT OPTIONS FOR GETTING WORK FXPFRIFNCF

Do a course that includes a research project or organisation case studies.

These can still give you that valuable employer perspective.

- Volunteer! Find a flexible role that links to your interests or studies.

  Join the Wellington Plus Programme and check out volunteer websites like Volunteer Wellington and Do Good Jobs.
- Make the most of your part-time work!
  Could you expand or diversity your part-time work. For example offer to do the social media for the shop or cafe you work in.
