2.1 Ngā whāinga

- He whakamahi i te reo kia puta ai tōna matū, tōna ngako, kia reka ai ki te taringa tangata arā he whakanikoniko, whakanakonako kōrero
- He tiki atu i ētahi o ngā kupu whakarite, whakataukī a kui mā a koro mā hei āwhina ki te tito kōrero mō te karanga me te whaikōrero
- He ako i ētahi tikanga o te karanga o te whaikōrero me te waiata
- He whakapūaki i te reo o te Karanga me te Whaikōrero ma te āta mahi ā tinana.

2.2 Whakarāpōpototanga o ngā mahi

- He wānanga, he pānui, he whakarongo, he mātakitaki, he rangahau, he tātari he whakatīnana i ngā kōrero a ngā tohunga o raurangi, o nātahirangi nei. - He titiro ki ētahi o ngā waiata aroha, waiata tangi kei roto i Ngā Mōteatea me ētahi atu pukapuka hei āwhina i te tauira ki te hanga whakaaro e taea ai ngā mahi Karanga/Whaikōrero
- He taki tū ki te whakatīnana, ki te pupuri i te mauri o te kupu, arā, kia hū ai te paorooro o te reo, kia tahu ana te āinga ki tā te whatumanawa i kāwata ai, kia pakaru iho hoki te manawa kohatu i te tītereere o te reo whakamōrearea

Kei te tauira te tikanga. Kauā e whakaaro kia tata tonu, kia tae tonu rānei ki ngā rā e ū mai ai ngā mahi nei. Kao! Hangaia i te wā e hihiko ana te wairua!

3.4.1 Whakarongo e te rau 10%

He mea whiri te waiata nei hei tīmata atu i te wānanga nei kia whai tāhūhū ai ngā akoranga whai kōrero/karanga, ā, kia hāngai pū ai ki te matua pou whare o Te Tumu Herenga Waka e poua ake nei i ngā kauwhata kōrero ka kauwhatatia ai e koutou, otirā, kia aro nui atu ki te mana o te paepae o te Rangiāhuta. Ko te tikanga o tēnei taumahī kia wāia ai koutou ki te whakawhānui, ki te whakaoho i tā koutou e mōhio nei mō te kōrero whakaniko. Āpiti atu ki tērā, kia mārama ai hoki ki ngā kōrero e kōputu ana ki roto i te waiata. Ko tā koutou, he whiriwhiri i tētahi o ngā rerenga kōrero o te waiata, ā, ka whakamāramahia mai ki te karaihe i te tino tikanga o taua rerenga kōrero. Ka tuarihia mai tēnei mā te Power Point.

3.4.2 Te Poroporoaki a Mohi Tūrei

20%

He āhua rite tonu tēnei ki te taumahi tuatahi, arā, he whiriwhiri i tētahi rerenga kōrero ka whakawhānui te aronga matua o taua rerenga kōrero. Ka tīwherawherahia e te tauira tāna i rangahau ai ki te karaihe, mā te Power Point. Engari, ehara hoki i te mea ka tuarihia noa ihohia ki te karaihe, ko tā koutou hoki, he āta whakatakoto mai i o koutou whakakitenga, me o koutou rangahau, he wānanga i te hōhonutanga o te mahi poroporoaki me tōna hīranga nui ki roto i te ao Māori. **No reira ko tētahi he whakaaturanga mā te power point, ko tētahi he tuhinga roa.** Kaua e iti iho i te rua mano kupu. Anei ētahi pātai hei whakahīhiko i a koutou:

- Kāore he whaikōrero he karanga kē rānei e rite ana ki te poroporoaki te ātaahua te hīranga rānei.

- Ko ngā paepae o ēnei rā he paepae kē mā te māngere mā te hōnia, hoki atu, hoki atu, ko aua karakia anō, ko aua waiata anō.
- Ko ngā kōrero i takea mai i ngā atua Māori anake ngā korero e tika ana mō runga i te paepae ehara ko ngā kōrero i takea mai i te Paipera Tapu, pēnei anō nei ki te rerenga “Kua haere ki tua i te ārai”
- Kua toka rawa te tikanga o tuakana/aina, he kaiaukati noa iho mo ētahi ahakoa tō rātau pakeke, he pai noa ake ētahi i ūnā ngā mea e whakawhiwhia ana ki taua tūranga motuhake.

3.4.3 He Whakamātautau paku 20%

Hei konei ka āta whakamātauria i tō koutou mōhio ki ngā kōrero katoa i kauhautia ki roto i ngā akomanga; Ka kore ana e tae mai ki nga karahe e kore e mau i a koutou nga kōrero ka tīrou atu ki roto i te whakamātautau. Ka rua hāora te roa o te whakamātautau.

Ā te 14th o Māhuru ka whakamātauria ai i a koutou

3.4.4 He Takutaku Waiata, He Takutaku Karakia 10%

Ko te aronga nui o tēnei taumahi he whakamātautau i tō koutou kaha ki te pupuri, me te whakahuahua i ngā karakia me ngā waiata ka whakaakohia atu ki a koutou. E pēnei ana te whakarite mō tēnei taumahi: Kia ono ngā waiata hei ako mā te tāne me te wāhine, engari ka noho ko te wahine hei kaiwhakahuahua hei kaiwaiata i ērā. He pērā anō mo te karakia, me ako te tāne me te wāhine i ngā karakia a Rawiri Te Kōkau, ēngari ka noho ko te tāne hei kaiwhakahuahua, hei kaikarakia rānei mō ērā. Mehemea ka hapa, ka tapepe rānei ka tangohia he māka.

Ā te 28 o Māhuru ka arotake i tēnei.

3.4.5 He Whaikōrero/Karanga – Kaupapa tene 1 & 2 10%

Hei konei ka whakamātauria i te whānui o te mōhio, i te tau o te mauri, i te mārama ki te kaupapa, i te whai i te kōrero e taea ai e koutou ngā tūāhuatanga katoa o te whaikōrero me te karanga te whakaari mai i te wā e poto ana te wā ki te whakarite i tō whare kōrero. No reira e ai ki te kōrero:

“E moe i te matahī tauā
Kaua ko te moe matahī tuna”

Mā te kaiako rā anō e tohu te kaupapa me te wā e tū mai ai tēnā me tēnā

3.4.6 Te Whakamātautau Whakamutunga 20%

Hei konei whakatīnanahia ai ngā mahi katoa. E tū mai ai tēnā, tēnā ki te whakamahi i ngā kupu, i ngā kōrero kua akohia, kua rangahautia i ngā wiki tekau mā rua. Me whakapūaki i te reo o te Karanga me te Whaikōrero mā te āta mahi ā tinana. Kāore hoki he kiko ki te kore e whakamahia te reo nei. Koia nei rā te tino pūtake kia whakamātauhia te reka o tō hanga i te kupu kōrero o

Rongomaraeroa. Kei reira kei runga i te umu pokapoka a Tū e whakahaeretia ai i tēnei whakamātautau.

Nā reira, me mahi te mahi i runga i te taumata ikeike i te taumata whakahirahira. Koinei hoki te panekiretanga o a koutou mahi mo tō koutou reo i Te Kawa a Māui. I tua atu o te whakaniko o te kupu ka whakamātauria anō hoki te reka o te reo, arā te haku, te wehi, te tangi, te kōingoingo o te wairua i te reka, me āta ranongahia hoki.

Ka tirohia te tau o te tū, te takahi, te hīkoi, te hītekiteki o te waewae; te mau rākau, rau rānei.

Kia maumahara he mahi rangatira tēnei i runga anō i te kōrero a Tamaterangi “*He ao te rangi ka uhia, ma te huruhuru te manu ka tau!*”

Hei muri whakanuia ai a koutou mahi. (Hei tōnā wā whakamōhiotia atu ai koutou i ngā whakarite).

Tuarihia a te Wiki 12 a te 9 o Whiringa -ā- nuku

4 E PUTA AI KI TE WHAI AO KI TE AO MĀRAMA

Me tae mai ki te nuinga o ngā karaihe, kia 20 rā mai i te 24.

- Me eke ia mahi whakamatautau ki te 50% o te whiwhinga i whakaritea.
- Me eke ki te taumata tau tuatoru mō te whakaniko kōrero.
- Me tutuki te whakamātautau whakamutunga, arā te whakatinana i te karanga me te whaikōrero.

Kia mataara! Ko te taumata tau tuatoru tēnei nā reira e tika ana me eke ō mahi ki te tekau mā waru hāora ia wiki mō tēnei akomanga. (Workload should be no less than 18 hours per week including lectures.)

6 NGĀ WHIU

Ki te kore e tutuki i a koe ngā whakaritenga mō ia tatauranga, kāore koe e hipa i tēnei karaihe. Me ū mai te katoa o ngā mahi i te rā kua whakaritea. Ka tangohia 5% mō ia rā ki te tōmuri. Me kōrero ki te pūkenga, māna anake e whakarite he wā e taea ai te whakaoti tika i o mahi. Kauā e haere i te ara a taihoa, ka tae ki aua atu!

Academic Integrity and Plagiarism

Plagiarism is a form of cheating which undermines academic integrity. The University defines plagiarism as follows:

The presentation of the work of another person or other persons as if it were one's own, whether intended or not. This includes published or

unpublished work, material on the Internet and the work of other students or staff.

It is still plagiarism even if you re-structure the material or present it in your own style or words.

Note: It is however, perfectly acceptable to include the work of others as long as that is acknowledged by appropriate referencing.

Plagiarism is prohibited at Victoria and is not worth the risk. Any enrolled student found guilty of plagiarism will be subject to disciplinary procedures under the Statute on Student Conduct and may be penalized severely. Consequences of being found guilty of plagiarism can include: an oral or written warning, cancellation of your mark for an assessment or a fail grade for the course, suspension from the course or the University. 10 Withdrawal Details

Have you changed your mind about the courses you want to do this trimester? If you do not withdraw from a course in time, you will receive a fail grade.

A fail grade stays permanently on your academic record. You can avoid the fail grade by withdrawing properly from courses before it is too late!

To withdraw from a course you must complete a change of course form, available from your Faculty Student Administration Office, and submit it by the following deadlines.

Second Trimester Papers, July – October 2007

No addition of first trimester courses permitted after **Friday, 20 July 2007**.

Withdraw before **Friday, 20 July 2007** and you will get a refund of fees. The course will no longer appear on your academic record.

Withdraw by **Friday, 21 September 2007** and you will avoid getting a fail grade on your student record. The course will be graded WD, which means ‘withdrawn’. This will remain permanently on your academic record but it is not a failing grade. Withdrawal (WD) grades do not appear on an official transcript.

Full-Year Papers, February – October 2007

No addition of full-year courses permitted after **Friday, 23 March 2007**.

Withdraw before **Friday, 9 March 2007** and you will get a refund of fees. The course will no longer appear on your academic record.

Withdraw by **Friday, 17 August 2007** and you will avoid getting a fail grade on your student record. The course will be graded WD, which means ‘withdrawn’. This will remain permanently on your academic record but it is not a failing grade. Withdrawal (WD) grades do not appear on an official transcript.
