## **TEACHING FORMAT**

This course comprises 2 hours of classes per week, some of which will be taken as masterclassstyle tutorials.

C: German

D: Italian

Trimester 2, week of 8 September to week of 13 October (Jenny Wollerman, Richard Greager)

### MANDATORY PAPER REQUIREMENTS

In addition to achieving an overall pass mark of 50%, students must:
